LIP ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN THIS MONTH

- June 2014
- Strengthen labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region
- **Community Employment Services Loyalist College** (CES) Employment Consultant met with four newcomers for employment counselling at QUIS in June 2014.
- June 2014
- QLIP Partnership developing plans for June 17, 2014 QLIP meeting
- Planning and preparing for the June 17, 2014 QLIP meeting
- Planning for presentations at the Partnership at the June 17, 2014 QLIP Meeting
- June 2014
- The Quinte Immigration Services database of newcomer employable skills and the Quinte Region employers' skills database
- through the review of hundreds of client files, online surveys and direct phone interviews, to create a catalogue of newcomer skills available to employers. The Quinte Region employers' skills database was created from intensive research using multiple directories and direct contact with companies to determine the type of skills required by employers. The QLIP Facilitator conducted multiple in-depth meetings with Jeff Wildgen, QUIS Research Coordinator and Tamara Malinski, QUIS Research Assistant, over the breadth of the research project to include much of June 2014. Intensive meetings were held during the period prior to and after the peer review QLIP Sub-meeting with QLIP Partner Ann McIntosh at East Central Ontario Training Board (ECOTB) on June 10, 2014. These frequent and in-depth meetings dealt with research approaches, methodologies, documentation, findings and methods to present the research in a manner that would highlight the utility of the information gleaned from both databases for use by organizations in the Greater Quinte

Region to include the work of the QLIP Partnership. The highlights of the findings entitled "The Quinte Economic Environment and Immigrant Labour Market Integration" were presented to the QLIP Partners at the June 17, 2014 QLIP meeting at which time Partners' feedback was documented. Following the QLIP meeting further discussions were undertaken to refine the research based on QLIP Partners input. It should be noted that in addition many in-depth meetings were held during the period before the presentation of the research findings at the QLIP meeting June 17, 2014.

- Bay of Quinte Living Council Mayors meeting Bay of Quinte Living Council QLIP Facilitator
 participated in this high level regional meeting of the mayors from the majority of
 municipalities, providing input on immigration issues, newcomer needs and the marketing
 campaign on attraction and retention of newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region.
- June 08, 2014
- Sustaining partnerships at the community level
- QLIP Partnership participated in the Quinte Employment Network Group (QEN) meeting.
 The Quinte Employment Network Group (QEN) represents a significant group of Employment Consultants, managers and employers in the Greater Quinte Area
- The main presentation was "Engaging People, Embracing Technology: The Greater Bay of Quinte Region's Strategy to Advance Manufacturing" by Mike Hewitt from the Quinte Economic Development Commission (QEDC) and the Manufacturing Resource Centre (MRC) (both QLIP Partners). Mike reviewed the results of the study with 62 manufactures from the region, including Napanee, Brighton, Belleville and Quinte West
- The need for foreign trained professionals was Included in the presentation as being part of the solution for employers needs

- QLIP Partnership advised the QEN members about the upcoming June 17, 2014 QLIP meeting emphasizing that there will be discussions on the disparity between what newcomers are qualified to do and the jobs they may have.
- Advised the QEN members about the QUIS Employer-to-client-source database and survey
 that confirmed many mismatches highly trained newcomers are working low skilled jobs.
- Manufacturers have an issue with Quinte region transportation deficiencies which aligns with the transportation difficulty facing newcomers to the Quinte Region. Mike Hewitt QEDC and MRC made mention of the Quinte Region and its transit malaise and noted as an example that there is a company in Trenton (Quinte West) that has a line (manufacturing production line) that can't run because people can't get there. The QLIP Partnership advised on the consequences of not having a well-developed (regional) transportation system in Quinte as it affects newcomers in terms of employment, attending both ESL and LINC courses at Loyola, and students attending Loyalist College. It was suggested that perhaps volunteer drivers could be arranged through Volunteer Information Quinte (VIQ)
- QLIP Partnership advised the QEN members that newcomers are unsure about going to
 employment referral agencies. Emphasis was placed on the collaborative partnership
 between Community Employment Services (CES) and QUIS to provide employment
 counselling at QUIS, which had assisted many newcomers and suggested more Employment
 Consultants from other employment offices may wish to join the established protocol.
- June 16 -20, 2014
- New Innovative QLIP Strategy for TVCOGECO June 16-20, 2014
- Discussions commenced in mid June 2014 with QLIP Partner TVCOGECO Cable 4 Belleville referencing their contributions and support of the QLIP goals and objectives. Discussions led to an innovative alternative approach moving away from providing video documentaries for viewing on the QLIP (and QUIS website) to providing a video collage of highlights from the documentaries on the QLIP website. The original documentaries will remain available on the TVCOGECO website and new documentaries will be aired on the TV COGECO Community TV Channel 4. QLIP strategy timelines remain the same for TVCOGECO Cable 4.
- Fresh innovative concepts are in discussion to include video vignettes featuring newcomers and their experiences. The QLIP Strategy an Action Plan for 2014/15/16 will be transformed from the original strategy to a new revised approach shown below:

- QLIP Partnership participated in the Loyola School of Adult and Continuing Education Celebration of Achievement
- Many QLIP Partners were present in support of the seventy-five newcomers who graduated from their ESL or LINC courses at a very large gathering (estimated at 150 to 200) which was covered by the Belleville Intelligencer newspaper and reported in the newspaper.

- Strengthen labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region
- QLIP Partnership widely disseminated information on a new network opportunity in Quinte West that could make a difference for newcomers in finding employment as many job opportunities are not advertised. This was a networking opportunity for young professionals 19-39 year olds who want to work together to share knowledge and build their social and professional networks. The event was sponsored by the City of Quinte West and the Quinte West Chamber of Commerce (both QLIP Partners). This event was offered to the young professionals in the entire Greater Quinte Region and the first event was held on Thursday, June 26, 2014 from 5:00 pm 7:00 pm at Stix & Stones 164 Front St, Trenton

- QLIP Facilitator meeting with Réseau de soutien à l'immigration francophone de l'Est de l'Ontario / Francophone Immigration Support Network of East Ontario
- QLIP Facilitator attended the meeting insuring QLIP connectedness to the Francophone community

- Strengthen labour market outcomes for newcomers to the Greater Quinte Region
- QLIP Partnership widely disseminated information on a second new network opportunity in Belleville that could make a difference for newcomers in finding employment. Belleville Emerging Leaders Group (BEL) a new initiative in Belleville aimed at helping the new professionals of the Belleville community thrive and become more connected with one another. BEL Open House Thursday July 3, 2014 from 4:30 6:30 at Café Sans Souci, 240 Front Street, Belleville, Ontario. The goal for the group is to have meetings and events where new professionals can receive mentoring from more experienced professionals, to promote networking, have guest speakers, fun social events and ultimately to build a solid group of Belleville's future professionals and leaders.

- QLIP Partnership commenced discussions on a Business Start Up Basics (BSB) Workshop to be provided by the Small Business Centre (a QLIP Partner) in partnership Quinte Immigration Services. The workshop will be helpful to newcomers as it is designed for absolutely anyone who has considered starting their own business or may be in the early stages of starting up. The workshop has been a recent success as it is a low pressure opportunity for someone to see the first steps to starting a business, with regional resources available, in a group setting. The workshop will be held on September 15, 2014 and newcomers with an interest will be encouraged to attend, with the assistance of Loyola, QUIS and QLIP Partners. In addition, this same workshop is under consideration to be held at Quint Immigration Services in the fall of 2014.

- QLIP Partnership had arranged for a presentation on the revised and redesigned QUIS
 website that was to be delivered at the QLIP Meeting on June 17, 2014 but due to the
 extended presentation of QUIS research at the meeting the review will need be updated and
 presented at the September 23, 2014 QLIP meeting.
- Advanced Planning for a QLIP meeting to be held on September 23, 2014 at the Multipurpose Room at the Quinte West Municipal office to be arranged
- The Multipurpose Room is booked from 9:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. and the meeting itself will be from 10 a.m. to 12 noon (9:30 a.m. meet and greet).
- This is a follow-up to the meeting in Quinte West in October of 2013 organized in effort to
 move the QLIP meetings to jurisdictions outside of Belleville. The previous meeting in Quinte
 West in October 2013 was a very successful and productive meeting as it led to the major
 accomplishment of the inclusion of Quinte Immigration Services presence on the "Bay of
 Quinte Region" website, and introduced the new QLIP Partner, Belleville Police Services.
