

TFW Working Group Survey Results

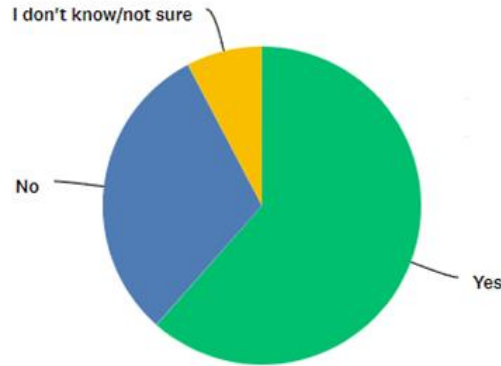
Although we captured a small amount of interested organizations (13 responses), we had very positive feedback on the TFW Working Group survey.

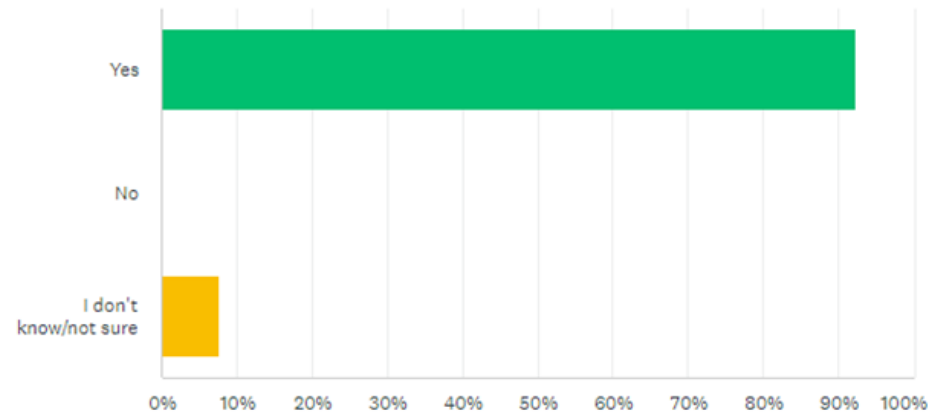

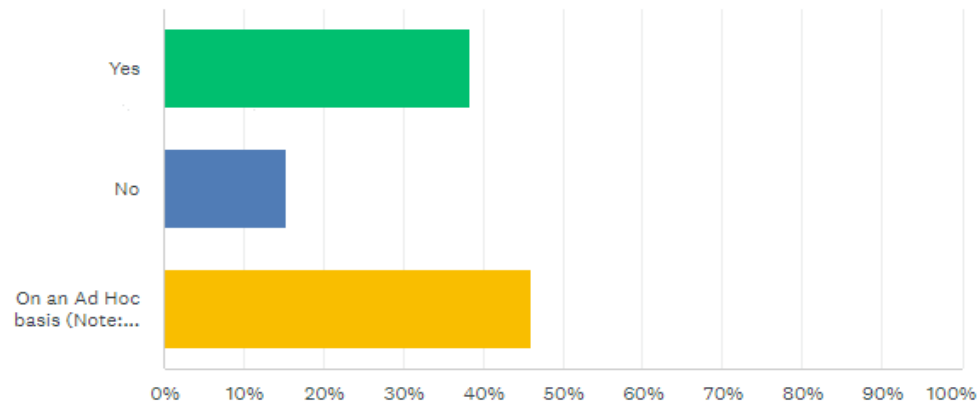

Highlights from Comments:

“As a contribution to the region economic development, TFW working group may bring together employers and service providers, to define, prioritize, and act upon TW needs; that will ensure the region becomes a more attractive and safe place to work for TW, and contribute to maintaining sustainable economy in the region.”

“I think there's an opportunity to gather various important actors related to health, legal, and social services in the community to benefit temporary foreign workers in the Quinte region.”

“With the increasing number of TFW's that are making the area their home, they need supports to help them navigate.”

“Temporary foreign workers have very specific concerns - and limited access to funded services and resources. A working group that can assist in sourcing out and identifying appropriate supports”

“Quinte is growing in terms of its need for labour both in traditional industries like farming and manufacturing, but also I'm seeing a large # of employers in tourism/ hospitality looking for labour as the industry grows and the labour shortage worsens.”
